Wild Brew Camp - Memorial Day Weekend



Ever wanted to combine camping and homebrewing? Ever curious about capturing the local flavor and funk of Oregon with wild yeast and friendly bacteria while spending a few days "off the grid"? Well that is exactly what we will be doing over Memorial Day weekend along the beautiful Trask River in Tillamook county! Come join fellow OBC members and friends from the Portland beer community, for 3 days of fun, great food, group brewing experiences and education.

Our guest speaker will be Trevor Rogers from De Garde Brewing in Tillamook, who will discuss various topics relating to sour and wild beer production, and will help the group brew two 30 gallon batches of wort with De Garde aged hops and fresh river water. This beer will be naturally cooled overnight in the campground and inoculated with the resident yeast and bacteria from the area. 20 participants will have the chance to receive three gallons of wort in their own carboys, or you may purchase a PET carboy for an additional \$15.

Participants will also be able to bring their own brew stands and setups if they wish. There is no reason we can not brew a few batches of clean beer as well! There will also be an amazing wild and sour beer tasting on Saturday night!

TRASK RIVER COUNTY CAMPGROUND



DETAILS:

- Registration must be processed through the OBC website (marking "Interested" or "Going" on Facebook does NOT hold your spot!)
- Each OBC member can bring 1 guest, 2 guests per couple at the member rate. Pets are allowed and cost an additional \$5 each
- A 1/3 deposit will be required to reserve your space (\$20 per person). Non-members must pay full registration.
- Riverfront campsites (blue) accommodate up to 12 people BUT only 2 vehicles and 3 tents total, or 1 RV/trailer plus 1 vehicle and 2 additional tents.
- Interior campsites (brown) will accommodate up to 8 people BUT only 1 vehicle and 2 tents per site, or 1 trailer and 1 additional tent.
- Registration fees include:
 - Campsite for all members or guests. Campsite assignments will be made in advance and groups will likely be combined
 - 2 group dinners (Saturday and Sunday) and 3 group breakfasts
 (Saturday, Sunday and Monday). Attendees are responsible for their own dinner Friday and lunches although leftovers may be available.
- Check-in is Friday 3:30pm and checkout is Monday 1:30pm. Attendees can arrive Saturday morning as well but the costs per person will NOT be prorated.

As a homebrew club, we wanted to reach out to you to share some information on Ballast Point's BJCP-sanctioned national homebrew contest, which is currently open for submissions. Since its inception in the back of Home Brew Mart in 1996, Ballast Point Brewing was founded on the innovation of the home brewing community and we're excited to honor our roots with a national contest to encourage homebrewers to pursue their passion. Six regional winners will be brought to San Diego to scale up their homebrews on Ballast Point's research and development brewery in San Diego, and one grand champion will be chosen among them to become a packaged beer by Ballast Point.

Contest registration is now open via online entry form at http://www.ballastpoint.com/og20. Entries will be accepted until May 25, 2016 unless the contest registration cap is met sooner.


Contest Details:

- Online registration opens on February 25, 2016 and closes on May 26, 2016 unless entry cap is reached before that time
- Registration fee is \$10, with maximum of 3 entries per entrant

- BJCP-certified judging to take place at Ballast Point Miramar on June 4, 2016
- Grand Champion will be announced at the 20th anniversary event on September 4, 2016

But they didn't do it alone. I have to believe that as a club, we can ride on their coattails a little bit because of our collective commitment to make better beer, and we did this by following my early request of providing honesty in our feedback. When someone hands a flawed beer to an OBC member we don't just choke it down and wrestle out a "it....it's good!" No, we tactfully provide helpful, actionable feedback to help that brewer make a better batch next time. Now honestly these 5 winners were already well on their way to making great beer on their own, but I've personally seen the quality of our club beers improve significantly over this last year. Case in point was our club booth at the PNWHC in Vancouver... wow we had some great beers on tap!

Now, is it any coincidence that every one of these guys is also very active within our club? They each serve on the current board of directors <u>or</u> have volunteered to help present an educational topic for our club. This kind of participation is what makes our club so great and I want to publicly thank all 5 of these guys for their involvement.

The message YOU can take from this is; *in order to make the best possible beers you must serve on the board of directors or volunteer to help your club in some way.*No!? Sound ridiculous? Prove me wrong, try running for a board position and see what happens to the quality of your beer!

Now, let's cheer on our contingent of OBC brewers as they submit their beers to Baltimore for the final round of the NHC competition and feel free to congratulate them the next time you see them. Way to go OBC!!

Members are responsible for submitting their own points. Make sure to submit them as soon

as you earn them so you aren't playing catch up. All members that submit more than 5 points will earn raffle tickets for the holiday party. Members will receive 1 raffle ticket for every 5 points submitted.

Fabulous upgrades to the Pilot System!

This year, we decided to spend the full pilot system budget on much needed upgrades and

improvements. A Brobdingnagian thank you to Brian Haslip for ordering the parts and assembling/transfiguring the system! Great iob!

Some of the improvements include:

- Added a 2nd, better pump on a new stand
- Improved the existing pump
- Added switches to both pumps
- replaced all of the hoses
- Added a sparge arm
- replaced the thermometers with a digital one
- Added a 3rd burner high BTU (Blichmann stand donated by Jim Thompson), that thing is a massive improvement!

Future improvements will include:


- replacing the other burners with high BTU
- etching of the interior of the keggles
- possible new keggles to expand the system
- Others? Your suggestions requested

In addition to the amazing upgrades and improvements, we are also improving the sign-out process.

There are new forms to complete that will allow you to request specific parts instead of the entire thing. This will enable multiple members to utilize the system simultaneously. Look for the new sign-out form online in 2016 to reflect these changes.






